## Road to Discovery: Transition to Adult Living, Learning and Working • Free Workshop

Planning for the future and setting high expectations for youth with disabilities can be a challenging time for families. This training will help families understand the importance of setting high expectations and give them the knowledge and skills they can use to achieve more positive outcomes for their youth. **Intended Audience:** • Families of 7th - 12th graders with IEP's • Students age 14 and older • Educators and other professionals who work with students with disabilities.

### MODULE #1

From Disability to Possibility: The Power of High Expectations in Transition Planning

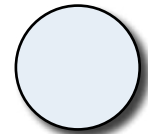
